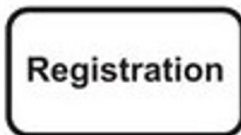
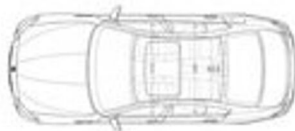




# I am Deaf or Hard of Hearing



I communicate using these method(s):

- American Sign Language
- Cued English
- Spoken language and sign language
- Writing/texting
- Lipreading

To communicate better with me:

- Please face me when speaking
- Do not cover your mouth with hand or paper
- Do not shine a flashlight in my face
- Speak in a typical tone - don't shout
- Try to eliminate background noise

## If pulled over by the police:

- If dark out, turn dome light on
- Put visor down
- Roll down window
- Stay in car, place hands on steering wheel, and wait for the officer.
- Point to visor card and self, hand card to the officer if necessary
- Indicate to the officer where and what you are going to reach for (license and registration)
- Politely answer any question

## Tips for using visor card

- Use a binder clip to attach to sun visor
- Assist the police by staying calm and cooperating.
- Police need to stay in control of the situation.
- If requested, hand the, officer your license and registration.
